RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Richmond County Fair will be held on Richmond County Fair property located on the left side of Rt. 3 between Verizon and the Northern Neck Regional Vocational Technical Center in Warsaw. Arts and crafts exhibits are displayed in the Northern Neck Regional Vocational Technical Center building.

2010 Fair Operating Hours are as follows:

Tuesday, August 24 – 6 p.m. until 11 p.m.
Wednesday, August 25 - 6 p.m. until 11 p.m.
Thursday, August 26 - 6 p.m. until 11 p.m.
Friday, August 27 - 10 a.m. until 12 midnight
Saturday, August 28 - 10 a.m. until 12 midnight

The Vocational Technical Center will be open for crafts/exhibits/demonstrations viewing the following hours during the 2010 Fair:

Wednesday, August 25 – 7 p.m.- 9 p.m.
Thursday, August 26 – 10 a.m. - 9 p.m.
Friday, August 27 - 10 a.m. - 9 p.m.
Saturday, August 28 - 10 a.m. - 3 p.m.

Items for exhibit in the 2010 Fair will be accepted at the Vocational School during the following hours:

Monday, August 23 - 5 p.m. - 7 p.m.
Tuesday, August 24 - 9 a.m. - 12 p.m.

Judging will be from 1 p.m. - 5 p.m. on August 24 and will continue at 10 a.m. on August 25. No spectators will be allowed in exhibit area during the judging.

**Exhibit items must be picked up on Saturday, August 28
between 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.**

Each department will have five (5) divisions. Each division will be governed by the same rules but judged separately. The divisions are:

Assisted Living Seniors/Nursing Home Residents
Adult Division - 19 years of age and above
Sr. Youth - 15 to 18 years of age
Jr. Youth - 11 to 14 years of age
Primary Division - 10 years of age and below

1st, 2nd, and 3rd, place ribbon prizes will be awarded in the Senior Division. The Junior Division will be placed using the Danish system. However, no first prize will be awarded unless the exhibit is worthy of first place even though there may be only one entry.

All crafts must be made or finished, as a quilt in the year 8/09 - 8/10. Only one exhibit per class per exhibitor will be accepted. An item **cannot** have been **exhibited in a prior year**. Miscellaneous items shall be entered under the exhibitor's choice class. Any miscellaneous exhibit with 3 or more entries will be judged as a separate class.

Care will be taken to protect exhibits but the Fair Association will assume no responsibilities for loss or damage, either to person or property. Exhibits will ONLY be accepted under these conditions.

FRESH FLOWER SHOW RULES

- ❁ All specimens in horticulture must be **grown by exhibitor**. Specimens are not to exceed 24” in height.
- ❁ Only one entry allowed in exhibition in each class.
- ❁ All designs must be the work of the exhibitor.
- ❁ Artificial flowers and foliage are not acceptable in any class. Plant material may be obtained from any source.
- ❁ Arrangements must be made at home except for minor repairs at time of placement.
- ❁ Exhibits must be picked up promptly.
- ❁ The Committee cannot be responsible for loss or damage to containers, although reasonable care will be exercised for their protection.

HOME PRODUCT RULES

All canned foods must be exhibited in clear standard glass jars with two piece metal lid tops (1/2 pint, pints, and quarts). **No labels of any kind are to be placed on jars**. All jars must be sealed.

All exhibits must be canned and made by exhibitor between August, 2009 and August, 2010.

Final decisions will be left to the discretion of the judges. **Awards will be withdrawn if spoilage occurs.**

After you decide what you wish to enter, stop by the Richmond County Extension Office and pick up tags for each item. Have these tags completed and attached to items when you bring them for entry in the Fair, August 23 or August 24, 2010!

Point Award System

The **Point Award System (PAS)** is a youth program sponsored by the Richmond County Fair Association, Inc. to serve as a platform for learning as well as recognizing and rewarding youth for their participation in the annual Richmond County Fair and other suitable and applicable youth development endeavors.

PAS Goals

- ▶ Encourage and provide opportunities for youth involvement in the Richmond County Fair in activities and competitions conducted during the annual fair to develop abilities in various areas including technical, leadership and interpersonal skills.
- ▶ Provide opportunities and encouragement for youth to participate in youth organizations in the community through competitions as individuals and organizations or clubs.
- ▶ Expand the mission of the Richmond County Fair Association, Inc.
- ▶ Provide a vehicle for the community-at-large to participate in the development of the fair exhibitors and invest in the viability of the event as a resource in the community.
- ▶ Provide a venue to showcase the talents of area youth.
- ▶ Encourage and enhance the opportunities of youth organizations to recruit participation and support.
- ▶ Provide a forum to expand the participation of community organizations in the fair.

Contest Areas

Competitions and contests will be in the following areas: home arts, fine arts, trade and industrial arts, production agriculture, horticulture, and leadership skills.

Home Arts includes: crafts, sewing, food preparation and preservation.

Fine Arts includes: painting, drawing, ceramics, and photography.

Trade and Industrial Arts includes: woodworking, electricity, welding, metallurgy/fabrication.

Production Agriculture includes: animal and crop production, tractor driving/safety, pet care.

Horticulture includes: ornamental plants, floriculture and vegetable production.

Leadership/Interpersonal Skills includes: participation in the Junior Fair Board, serving as a volunteer, interview judging.

Contest Rules

- Ages 5 - 19.
- Participation in any of the areas listed and providing the appropriate completed entry forms respective of all due dates applicable and according to all other rules for each department.
- A youth organization affiliation is required for participation in excess of 5 (five) entries in the competition and certain livestock categories.
- Contest entries will be judged, where applicable, by the Danish System, in all other situations by the Comparative System. The Danish System is one in which each project is judged for its individual merit against a standard. Therefore, it is not uncommon or impossible for more than one blue ribbon to be awarded, should the quality of the project warrant such a placement. Should the contest require a final winner, the Comparative System shall be used and competitive criteria employed.
- Exhibits showing **Excellent Work** will receive a **Blue Ribbon** denoting an **Award of Excellence**. Exhibits showing **Good Work** will receive a **Red Ribbon** denoting a **Good Award**. Creditable exhibits will be given a **White Ribbon** denoting a **Worthy Award**.

Point Award System

- Points will be awarded based on the award designated by the judge of the project.
- The judge's decision shall prevail.
- Virginia Association of Fairs certified judges will be used when possible to evaluate the projects.
- Each department will have a point schedule set and published in advance of the contest. This will be used to determine the points earned for the corresponding award. This will allow for differences in project difficulty, time, skills, and investments to be recognized. For example, a blue ribbon cookie will not receive the same number of points as a blue ribbon birdhouse or calf.
- At the completion of the fair, all the points earned in the various categories by an individual will be totaled and form the basis for their monetary award.
- The Richmond County Extension Leadership Council (ELC) shall provide oversight and input to the program. This will be in the form of recommendations to the Richmond County Fair Board on the implementation of the overall PAS program including program design and application as well as award values in consideration of the funds raised and the level of participation of the youth.
- The prize jackpot will be the source of funds used to award participating youth. These funds will have been raised by the Richmond County Fair Association, Inc., from various sources including local community groups, individuals, companies and foundations.
- The prize jackpot will be divided into scholarships and awards "mini-jackpots". The awards amount will be divided by the total number of points awarded at the event for all participants in the various categories. This will determine the cash award per point that will then be used to calculate the individual cash awards for participating youth.
- The scholarship amount will be awarded to youth based on total points earned at the event as recognition for "high point" individuals. The value of these scholarships may vary and, depending on the fundraising program, may be in honor of or in memorial of or specifically sponsored by an individual, company, or organization. These scholarships can be used for educational program participation and are not limited, but certainly will be allowed to accrue for college tuition. The Richmond County ELC will have final consideration of any questions in the use of these funds, which must be expended by the time the individual is 23. Scholarship awards are not transferable.
